2010 "Uncle Sam" Membership TEAM Successful Recruiting Summary

- 1. JUST ASK.** It all starts by asking a prospective candidate to join La Societe. If you don't do this they may not even know that they are eligible to be a member.
- 2.** How can you sell them on joining La Societe? First step is sell yourself! You can't talk someone into something very easily, but you can surely talk them out of it.
- 3.** Explain to them what the Forty and Eight represents and what we do for veterans and the community. You must create an interest in joining. A candidate is not likely to join any organization that they know little or nothing about. However, don't overload them with information.
- 4.** Ask "Are you a member?" If the answer is "No," Ask why not, and then **SHUT UP** and let them keep talking. Soon they will say something like "Maybe I should be," or "How do I join?" Then agree with them, and fill out the application **NOW**.
- 5.** Be prepared for "No's." Treat "no" as though it was a request for more information. When asked "What's in it for me?" tell them, but don't overdo it. You should always point out that the main thing they will get is the opportunity to continue to serve by helping other veterans and members of their community.
- 6.** Be prepared to answer objections, but don't use a prepared script or "canned" answer.
- 7.** If what you are doing isn't getting new members, **CHANGE WHAT YOU ARE DOING.**
- 8.** You can't do something the way someone else does it. Mold your recruiting techniques to fit your personality. Everyone is not the same.

9. You are not him or her. **YOU ARE YOU.** You have unique talents and abilities. Use them to share the benefits and good news about La Societe.
10. Don't be afraid to look beyond the limits of your Post, your other organizations, or your circle of friends. Prospective candidates can be found everywhere. So go out and get them. I heard somewhere that successful people make things happen, while unsuccessful people make excuses. Be one of the successful ones.

I hope everyone had a very Merry Christmas and Happy New Year's Eve. The Holidays are over. It's a New Year, and with it comes new challenges, new ways of helping children, and new ways of raising the money we need to support our 40/8 programs, and new ways of providing a little fun and happiness for the children. I know, I know, most of us are a little beat down from all the hustle and bustle of the holidays, but now is not the time

to sit on the laurels of past accomplishments (just be sure you report them at the end of the 40/8 year.) There are still children in need of our help. At this time there are 21 Voitures in Grand du Florida that have not taken 2010 National Child Welfare Pins, and Five Voitures that have signed for pins but have not paid for them yet. I still have pins available, call, E-Mail or see me at Petite if you would like to have pins. Your cost is \$2.00 per pin, you can sell them for any amount you want and keep the profit. Here is one solution to getting "free" Child Welfare Pins: The first year I was Sous Directuer Child Welfare, I paid for 20 pins, @\$2.00, sold them for \$3.00, did the same thing the next year, and had a profit of \$40.00. VAVS News for January, 2010

Another year is past. Mary and I hope that you had a profitable and healthy year and our new year will be better for all. We hope to see lots of friend at Petite in Ocala. We'll be looking for you, so plan to join the crowd.

Aid & Attendance Update 03: This Special Pension (part of the VA Improved Pension program) allows for Veterans and surviving spouses who require the regular attendance of another person to assist in eating, bathing, dressing, undressing or taking care of the needs of nature to receive additional monetary benefits. It also includes individuals who are blind or a patient in a nursing home because of mental or physical incapacity. Assisted care in an assisted living facility also qualifies. This most important benefit is overlooked by many families with Veterans or

surviving spouses who need additional monies to help care for ailing parents or loved ones. This is a "pension benefit" and is not dependent upon service-related injuries for compensation. Most Veterans who are in need of assistance qualify for this pension. Aid and Attendance can help pay for care in the home, nursing home or assisted living facility. For 2009 a single veteran is eligible for up to maximum benefit of \$1,645 per month (\$19,736 annually), while a surviving spouse is eligible for up to \$1,057 per month (\$12,681 annually). A couple is eligible for up to \$1,950 per month (\$23,396 annually). To be eligible the veteran must have served during one of the following periods:

World War II: December 7, 1941 through December 31, 1946. *Korean War:* June 27, 1950 through January 31, 1955. *Vietnam War:* August 5, 1964 (February 28, 1961, for veterans who served "in country" before August 5, 1964), through May 7, 1975. *Gulf War:* August 2, 1990, through a date to be set by law of Presidential Proclamation.

The VA must determine that your net worth is such that it will probably not support you through the remainder of your life. The VA does not include primary residence or vehicles when determining net worth. To qualify you must have a "countable income" of less than the pension amount to be eligible for all or a portion of the pension. Countable Income is the amount of income a veteran or surviving spouse receives each year including rollover interest, AFTER deducting all unreimbursed, and recurring health care expenses. This includes assisted living costs, home health care, insurance & Medicare premiums, on-going pharmacy costs and more. If you have dependents, their health care costs can also be used to reduce your countable income. However, their income must also be added into the equation. See:

www.vba.va.gov/bln/21/pension/vetpen.htm#3 for additional details on the Aid & Attendance pension. Application to the VA for this benefit can be made by any of the following methods: On line at <http://vabenefits.vba.va.gov/vonapp/main.asp>; or at <http://www4.va.gov/vaforms> download and fill out VA Form 21-526, Veteran's Application for Compensation and/or Pension. Send the completed application and any copies of other documents to the VA regional office that serves your area of

residence. Make sure you download all parts of the application as well as the instructions for filling out the forms. If available, attach copies of dependency records (marriage & children's birth certificates). Contact a Veterans Service Officer (VSO) from a veterans service organization. To locate call 1-800-827-1000, for the location of the nearest VSO nearest you. Also, you can refer to <http://www1.va.gov/vso> for a list of the nationally recognized Veterans Service Organizations.

VIETNAM SERVICE MEDAL: The Vietnam Service Medal is awarded to all members of the Armed Forces of the United States serving in Vietnam and contiguous waters or airspace there over, after 3 JUL 65 through 28 MAR 73. Members of the Armed Forces of the United States in Thailand, Laos, or Cambodia, or the airspace there over, during the same period and serving in direct support of operations in Vietnam are also eligible for this award

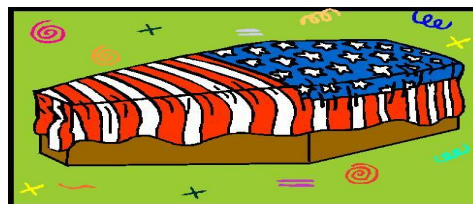
