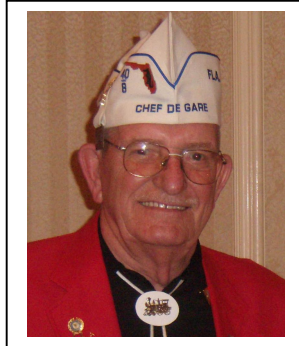

VAVS

Scam Targets Vets: The VA reports that a reprehensible scam is targeting veterans. Scammers are calling VA beneficiaries under the guise of a phony "Patient Care Group". The caller claims that VA prescriptions are being administered by this company. The scammers ask for personal information, including credit card information, claiming that this is necessary for the beneficiary to keep receiving prescriptions through the VA. ***This***

is completely bogus. The VA does not call vets and ask them to disclose personal information over the phone, and the VA hasn't changed any prescription dispensing rules. ***Be safe. Never give out personal information to any unsolicited phone caller.***

HIV TESTS: The VA has announced that it will begin routinely offering HIV tests to all veterans who receive care at its medical facilities. Under the new policy, veterans must verbally consent to the test. However, they can opt to decline being tested. The new policy follows recommendations from the Centers for Disease Control, which advised that all patients should be offered HIV testing even if they are not considered at risk. FIGHTING THE FLU: ***The CDC urges you to take the following three actions to protect yourself and others:***

- 1. Take time to get vaccinated**
- 2. Take everyday preventive actions**
- 3. Take flu antiviral drugs if your doctor recommends them.** Hand washing and alcohol-based sanitizers are very effective. Rregular soap is effective, so wash frequently.

VA DISABILITY COMPENSATION

Approximately 3 million veterans—about 2 million of whom are under age 65—receive compensation from the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) for their service connected disabilities. The amount is based on a rating of an impairment's effect on a veteran's earnings capacity, on average; disability ratings range from zero to 100%. Additional allowances are paid to veterans whose disabilities are rated 30% or higher and who have dependent spouses, children, or parents. Veterans with disabilities may also qualify for cash payments from other sources, including workers' compensation; private disability insurance; means-tested program benefits, such as Supplemental Security Income; and, for veterans under 65, the Social Security Disability Insurance (DI) program.

Power Car Fraud: The head of a company that promised seniors agile, lightweight power scooters but delivered bulky motorized wheelchairs -- and bilked the government out of thousands of dollars

-- was sentenced to 92 months in prison. Prosecutors described a bait-and-switch scheme in which CBI ran TV ads showing elderly people zipping around on easy-to-manuever scooters. But people who ordered them were sent heavy wheelchairs that in some cases were too large to operate in their homes. CBI would then bill Medicare, which paid thousands of dollars more for the chairs than for scooters. [Source: The Roanoak Times Mike Gangloff article 4 Sep 09]

VA relief of health care cost for out of work vets.

The VA offers an assortment of programs that can relieve health care costs or provide care at no cost to veterans who are struggling financially because of a job loss or decreased income. Veterans whose previous income was ruled too high for VA health care may be able to enter the VA system based on hardship if their current year's income is projected to fall below federal income thresholds. The fall must be caused by job loss, separation from service, or some other financial setback. Veterans determined eligible because of hardship can avoid copayments applied to higher-income veterans. Qualifying veterans may be eligible for enrollment and receive health care at no cost. Enrollment coordinators at each VA medical center across the country can provide veterans with information about these programs. Veterans also may contact the VA's Health Benefits Service Center at (877) 222-VETS (8387) , or visit the VA's Health Care Eligibility and Enrollment Web site at www.va.gov/healtheligibility.

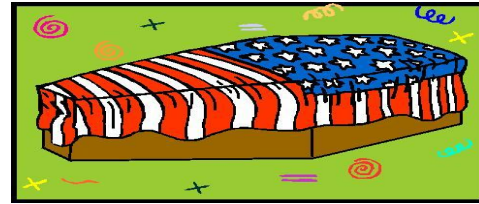
